

Behavior Cue Symbols

Behavior cue symbols are an effective strategy to reinforce verbal directives and behavioral expectations. These symbols are great for children with limited language skills and provide teachers a non-intrusive way of redirecting all children in their classrooms.

For successful implementation, teachers should introduce the symbols to children, pair it with the verbal directive and model the expected behavior prior to everyday use.










1. Print the behavioral cue symbols
